SUBJECT: Physical Examinations

TO: All Employes

FROM: B. Marshall, M.D., Medical Director

Questions have been asked by employes who have been here for some time concerning the laboratory and medical examinations that they have recently been asked to report for.

These examinations are required, yearly if possible, by the Department of Public Welfare. Section 8479 of the DPW Manual states that "the categories of employes to be examined are as follows:

- a. Those in frequent contact with patients, students or trainees.
- b. Those whose work requires participation in physical activity, including recreational responsibilities.
- c. Those employed as operators of Commonwealth-owned vehicles.
- d. Employes engaged in food preparation and services."

We have been doing new employes first and gradually picking up longer term employes as day and evening physicians (and the clinic and laboratory staffs) have time for this.

If you are asked to report for these examinations, either to the lab or to the dispensary in the hospital, you are required to go at the appointed time, and your supervisor must provide you with relief so that coverage can be maintained. Failure to comply can lead to disciplinary action.

The examinations made are predetermined by the Department of Public Welfare. They are based on the forms provided and do not include embarrassing or painful procedures (except for the withdrawal of a small blood sample from the fingertip). Your cooperation for this required service will be greatly appreciated.
